NEWS FROM SUPREME

Knights of Columbus Insurance: once again highest ratings, stable outlook

Two top financial research and analysis companies recently reaffirmed their highest ratings for the Knights of Columbus insurance program. Both A.M. International Silver Rose Pilgrimage - Our Lady of Guadalupe

Tuesday, October 27, 2009 (13:39:34)

For those of you interested in attending the transfer of the Silver Rose from Oklahoma to Texas, it will take place at St. Mary's Church in Gainesville, TX at the 4:00pm Saturday Vigil Mass on November 28. The officers of the Oklahoma State Council have scheduled the running of the Rose from Marietta, OK to Gainesville for that Saturday morning, with completion in time to dress and prepare for Mass. Please consider joining us for this final portion of the Rose's journey in Oklahoma.

The route will follow Hwy 77, south from Marietta to the state line.

Attached is information concerning the 50th running of "La Rosa Plata", the Silver Rose of Our Lady of Guadalupe, transfer of the Rose from the United States to Mexico at the International Bridge in Laredo, TX on December 10, 2009 and Mass at the Basilica in Monterrey, Mexico on December 12, the Feast of Our Lady of Guadalupe. This was started by the Squires of Mexico in 1960, when the Rose came from Canada, through the United States to Monterrey and has continued every year since. This year, 3 Roses started in Ontario, Canada and are traveling throughout the United States, where they will arrive in Texas at El Paso, Beaumont and Gainesville and make their way to Laredo for transfer to Mexico. From Laredo, the Squires of Mexico will run them to the Basilica in Monterrey for the opening procession at the 5:00pm Mass on December 12, offered by Cardinal Ortega.

We are planning for transportation from Oklahoma City to Laredo and more info about this will be forthcoming. You may also fly into Laredo and participate in both the Laredo activities and the trip to Monterrey or just the Laredo activities.

Hope you can take part in this most moving and religious experience. Please pass this along to others who might be interested in attending.

FATHER JOHN'S CORNER



“OPEN WIDE.....”

The phrase “**open wide...**” is probably one that we most fear. It is what the doctor says to us when he or she exams our throat. It is what the dentist says to us when he or she gets ready to work on our teeth. When I hear the words “open wide....”, immediately the palms of my hands begin to sweat.

But there is another meaning for the phrase “open wide...”. It is the invitation to “**Open Wide.... The Doors to Christ!**” As we soon will embark on the new Church year no one’s palms should sweat. On the contrary, you and I need to be excited and filled with awe as we enter this new beginning. Unlike the many doors we have passed through over the years this door is unique. It is the door that leads to life, life to the full, found only in Jesus Christ.

The Church’s invitation to “**Open Wide the Doors to Christ**” concerns not just the doors of our churches. It is an invitation to shift our focus from ourselves and focus on what God desires to do with and for each of us. God wants to open all the doors that are locked or barred closed. It is God who is knocking. We have the doorknob on our side of the door. It is up to you and me to say yes and allow the locked doors of our lives to be open by God.

I remember reading a flyer that describes the Blessing of Jubilee Doors in Rome. I found it very helpful for my own reflection and prayer. I want to quote a short piece from it. *“Christ stands at our hearts and knocks. He calls tenderly to us, and as in the upper room where the disciples huddled in fear, he calls out to us: ‘Do not fear! It is I!’*

And so the first jubilee door I am called to prepare is the door to my heart. I am called to open my heart to Christ. Like Mary, who bore him deep within her body, Christ gives us the grace to open our hearts to the conversion, unity and justice of the Kingdom of God.”

When you hear Christ inviting you to “**Open Wide....**” remember it is about the door of your heart that he is asking to enter. Do not be afraid. As Knights we must never fear! As Knights we are to give witness to the truth and power of Jesus Christ by our lives. And remember the Lord is inviting each of us to, “**Open Wide The Doors to Christ!**”




HAVE A BLESSED AND HAPPY THANKSGIVING


